HOW TO APPLY

Beginning in October of each year, students may apply for admission online at www.csumentor.edu.

The priority filing periods are as follows:

Fall 2007 admission:

October 1, 2006 - November 30, 2006

Spring 2008 admission:

August 1, 2007 - August 31, 2007

Fall 2008 admission:

October 1, 2007 - November 30, 2007

Spring 2009 admission:

August 1, 2008 - August 31, 2008

Applications may be accepted after the priority filing periods, but on a space availability basis.

After applying be sure to submit your \$55.00 application fee (or application fee waiver), transcripts, and test scores (if applicable) to the Enrollment Center as soon as possible.

Admissions applications are processed in the order that an applicant's file is complete with all required documents. All admission decisions are provisional until final, official documentation is received.

CSUCI, the 23rd campus in the California State University System, is located at the base of the Santa Monica Mountains midway between Santa Barbara and Los Angeles. Committed to academic excellence, community involvement, environmental responsibility, and leadership for the 21st century, CSU Channel Islands invites students to visit our campus and *Experience the Difference*.

CSU Channel Islands opened in fall 2002 to upper-division transfer students and the first freshman class will graduate in spring 2007. In fall 2006, the campus student body will include nearly 3,000 students.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

FIRST-TIME FRESHMAN

To be eligible for regular admission as a first-time freshman, you must:

- Have or will have graduated from high school
- Have completed, with a grade of “C” or better, the following college preparatory subject requirements:
 - 4 years: English
 - 3 years: Mathematics (Algebra, Geometry, Intermediate Algebra)
 - 2 years: Social Science, including one year of US History or US History and Government)
 - 2 years: Science with a laboratory (one year biological, one year physical)
 - 2 years: Language other than English (the same language)
 - 1 year: Visual and Performing Arts (course must be a single year-long course)
 - 1 year: Elective
- Earn a qualifiable eligibility index: California residents must have a minimum CSU eligibility index of 2900 using SAT I scores or 694 using ACT scores. Non-California residents must have a minimum CSU eligibility index of 3502 using SAT or 842 using the ACT. The eligibility index is calculated based on grades achieved in the 10th - 12th grade and scores from the SAT I (Critical Reading and Mathematics Total) or ACT.

For the purposes of admissions, CSU Channel Islands uses the SAT I: Critical Reading and Math Scores for the SAT I Total.

SAT I Scores: $(\text{Your GPA}) * x 800 + \text{SAT I Total} = \text{Index}$
 ACT Scores: $(\text{Your GPA}) * x 200 + (10 \times \text{ACT Comp}) = \text{Index}$

*GPA excludes 9th grade, PE, and ROTC

TRANSFER STUDENTS

To qualify for admission as an upper-division transfer student, you must complete the following prior to entrance:

- Have a minimum of 60 or more transferable semester units**
- Have a college grade point average of 2.00 (2.4 for non-California residents) or better in all transferable college units attempted
- Be in good standing at the last college or university attended. (i.e., You must be eligible to re-enroll in your last college/university)
- Have completed (or will complete prior to transfer) at least 30 semester units (45 quarter units) of courses equivalent to general education requirements with a grade of "C" or better. The 30 units must include all of the general education requirements in communication in the English language (English composition, oral communication, and critical thinking) and at least one course of at least 3 semester units (4 quarter units) required in college-level mathematics.

*** No more than 70 transferable semester units from a community college may be used towards the minimum 120 units needed to obtain a degree.*

POSTBACCALAUREATE / GRADUATE STUDENTS

To qualify for admission as a postbaccalaureate student, you must complete the following prior to entrance:

- Have completed a four-year college course of study and hold an acceptable baccalaureate degree from an institution accredited by a regional accrediting association
- Have attained a grade point average of at least 2.5 (A = 4.0) in the last 60 semester (90 quarter) units attempted

Please note: If you are applying to a credential or graduate program, you must complete an additional supplemental application and meet program requirements. Please contact the specific program to which you are applying for additional information.

FINANCIAL AID

The mission of the Financial Aid office is to help students pursue their educational goals by making college an affordable experience. There are various types of aid available in the form of loans, grants, and scholarships. In order to be eligible for aid, students must satisfy the following requirements:

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) via paper or online at www.fafsa.ed.gov
- Demonstrate financial need, with the exception of some loan programs
- Be admitted as a regular student working toward a degree in an eligible program
- Be a US Citizen or an eligible non-citizen
- Not be in default on a prior student loan or owe a refund on a grant
- Be in good academic standing (making satisfactory academic progress)

RECREATION AND LEISURE SERVICES

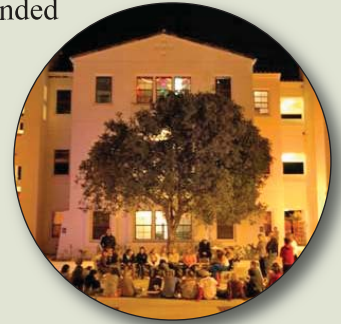
